




**January: Preaching & Teaching Series** 

Habakkuk is unusual as a prophetic book. It never addresses the people of Judah directly. Rather it is a dialogue between the prophet and God. The prophet Habakkuk was probably a contemporary of Zephaniah and Jeremiah, and possibly even of Ezekiel and Daniel. He probably prophesied no later than the end of Josiah's reign (640-609 B.C.).



Habakkuk 2:2-3 ESV

There are two kingdoms: Northern (Israel) & Southern Kingdoms (Judah). The <u>Northe</u> <u>Kingdom</u> includes 10 tribes: Reuben, Simeon, Dan, Naphali, Gad, Asher, Ephraim, Manasseh, Issachar and Zebulun.

Habakkuk prophesied during the time where the Chaldeans (Babylonians rose to power and prominence around 612 BC.

He probably prophesied no later than the end of Josiah's reign (640–609 B.C.).

Jeremiah also prophesied during this time around 626 BC and 580 BC)

Jeremiah was a Hebrew prophet who was involved in various political and religious events. His faithfulness to God and spiritual leadership to the people helped them to survive disasters that included the capture of Jerusalem by the Babylonians around 586 BC and the exile of the Judeans to Babylonia.

The Assyrian empire, which had been dominant for two centuries, declined and fell. Its capital, Nineveh, was captured in 612 by the Babylonians and Medes. Egypt had a brief period of resurgence under the 26th dynasty (664–525) but did not prove strong enough to establish an empire. The new world power was the Neo-Babylonian empire, ruled by a Chaldean dynasty whose best known king was Nebuchadrezzar.



Both Habakkuk & Jeremiah saw a moral and spiritual decline in the southern kingdom.

Why do you make me look at injustice? Why do you tolerate wrongdoing? Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife, and conflict abounds.


Therefore the law is paralyzed, and justice never prevails. The wicked hem in the righteous, so that justice is perverted.
